



Fredericton High School is the oldest English High School in Canada, established in 1785 as the Provincial Academy of Arts and Sciences. It is currently located on the south side of the City of Fredericton at 300 Priestman Street. The FHS student population is comprised of over 400 International students representing 82 countries. FHS has 85 classrooms, 6 technology labs, 1 maker space lab, 1 media center, physics, biology, chemistry and general science labs, 4 art rooms, 4 music rooms, 6 vocational classrooms, 1 support center, 1 theatre, bi-level library, 3 gymnasiums and a cafeteria. FHS also has a football field, 2 soccer fields and a track, as well as, practice fields.

Fredericton is the capital of the Canadian province of New Brunswick. The city is situated in the west-central portion of the province along the Saint John River. One of the main urban centres in New Brunswick, it is the third-largest city in the province after Moncton and Saint John. An important cultural, artistic, and educational centre for the province, Fredericton is home to two universities, the New Brunswick College of Craft and Design, and cultural institutions such as the Beaverbrook Art Gallery and The Playhouse, a performing arts venue. The city hosts the annual Harvest Jazz & Blues Festival, attracting regional and international jazz, blues, rock, and world artists. Fredericton is a very active city offering many opportunities for sports, recreation, dance, etc. It maintains more than 80 km of trails accessible to pedestrians and cyclists and has the only fixed structure six-court indoor tennis facility in Atlantic Canada.
