



## NB ADVANTAGE GLOBAL PROGRAM

Mount Allison University has incentives for New Brunswick Offshore Student Program (NBOSP) students to further benefit from the unique opportunity of studying in New Brunswick. With the NB Advantage Global Program, **international students graduating from offshore high schools participating in the NBOSP will be charged domestic tuition fees for the first two years of their degree program — an estimated overall savings of \$20,000.**

Students whose performance in English 112A and English 112B indicates the likelihood of strong performance in English 122 or English 121 may be accepted for students who have not yet completed English 122 or English 121 at the time of admission.

Students who do not satisfy the English proficiency requirement by these means may complete one of our English language bridging programs; or submit an accepted proof of English proficiency.

## FREE NEW BRUNSWICK MEDICARE FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

All international students who possess a valid study permit and provide proof of full-time registration as a student at a New Brunswick college or university, and remain enrolled in a full-time course load for the entire academic year, will be eligible for free Medicare coverage after the first year.
