

The New Brunswick Advantage Program

Mount Allison University has a new incentive for New Brunswick International Student Program (NBISP) students to further benefit from the unique opportunity of studying in New Brunswick. With the New Brunswick Advantage Program, international students graduating from New Brunswick high schools will be charged domestic tuition fees for the first two years of their degree program — an estimated overall savings of \$18,720.

The English proficiency requirement is met by completing at minimum Grade 11 and 12 in an Anglophone NB school. Otherwise, students must provide an accepted English proficiency test in order to receive a full offer of admission. Conditional offers will be made for those students who meet the academic requirements, but not the English proficiency requirements. New Brunswick Medicare now available for international students

All international students who possess a valid study permit and can provide proof of full-time registration as a student at a New Brunswick college or university, and remain enrolled in a full-time course load the entire academic year, will be eligible for free Medicare coverage, as will their spouse and dependents. This will help address additional out-of-pocket expenses for international students if they choose New Brunswick.

Living in Sackville, New Brunswick, Canada

Sackville is a safe, welcoming, and inclusive small town surrounded by nature. The downtown is just a five-minute walk from campus, you can drive to all major centres in the region in two hours or less, and an international airport is less than a 30-minute drive away. Students will find the cost of living much lower than other Canadian destinations.

The Bridging Program

A new option is being offered for students to meet the admissions English language requirement. Students with IELTS 6.0 (with a minimum band score of 5.5) or TOEFL iBT 80 can join Mount Allison University and begin their program courses followed by tutoring sessions each day. The program is designed to be a two term (fall & winter) program.

ATLANTIC IMMIGRATION PROGRAM

It allows graduating students with full-time job offers in an Atlantic province (New Brunswick, Newfoundland and Labrador, Nova Scotia, or Prince Edward Island) to apply for permanent residency (PR) sooner.
